Energetic test vs Clinical test

Energetic screening tests are not comparable with and do not correspond to a clinical or laboratory test, such as a blood test. Energetic testing examines frequencies, whereas a blood test examines substances or molecules in the body's fluids. Energetic testing “asks” the body questions in holistic terms, whereas a blood test determines clinically established markers.

The path towards our pet's wellness

Every day our furry companions may come in contact with hundreds of different things. Materials, substances, environmental elements, and of course foods and food ingredients. It is only natural that some of these numerous items may affect its overall health. When it demonstrates sensitivity to one or more of them, it reacts, “telling” something is *wrong*.

In several occasions, like people, animals with generally good health may experience mild or less mild symptoms without us being able to find out what causes them. Sometimes it is even difficult to receive informed help from the vet. There are so many foods, so many materials and products that we use or are present in the places animals may find themselves, that it's impossible to know in advance what may affect them.

Allergies are easier to detect in general, as they have more direct, severe and temporary symptoms, while they manifest soon after contact, for example after the consumption of an allergenic substance. When allergy manifests, the immune system is triggered, producing IgE or IgG antibodies. Sensitivity to foods or materials or having certain sensitive organs/body functions is usually milder but chronic, while it is not detected with the regular clinical tests used to identify allergies.

When sensitivities occur, the body may trigger IgG antibodies or express its reaction in a psychosomatic manner or through a pseudoallergy. Its symptoms vary in nature and frequency.



How to use your test results

1

Identify items that affect your cat as a result of **exposure or consumption**. These items may belong to food categories you may opt to remove from its diet for at least 30 days, materials or chemicals you may want to minimise any contact with whatsoever.

2

Identify parts/areas in its body (organs, bones etc.) that are in a state of imbalance. Consider **adapting** diet, supplementation and vet care in a way that includes those parts/areas.

3

Identify pathogens and toxins that appear to affect your cat. You could consider adapting its diet and focus of healthcare towards eliminating these factors.

Important Tips



Once you start adjusting your cat's diet and lifestyle, try to observe changes or reactions. For example, milder symptoms, better mood, etc., and remember what contributes to its wellness.

Your pet's sample is tested for several different items. You may not always remember or be able to find out how and when it came in contact with a material or when it consumed a certain ingredient.

But keep in mind these items may be found even in the strangest places, even at home.

This section includes environmental agents, pollutants found in the atmosphere (indoors or outdoors), as well as some industrial products and chemicals that appear to affect your cat. It is recommended to avoid letting it near places where it may be exposed to them.

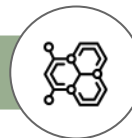

Phenols are natural chemical compounds contained in food items and environmental substances. One single phenol can be found in more than 80 sources. Hence, sensitivity to phenols often explains sensitivity appearing in specific food items.

Descriptions of the phenols appearing in your cat's results are included below.

Acetaldehyde

Indications: Petrochemical sensitivity, perfumes, flavors, dyes, plastics, synthetic rubber, alcohol, spreading phenomenon of allergies to foods, sugar metabolism and candida disorders.

Sources: Car exhaust, perfumes, flavors, aniline dyes, synthetic rubber, produced in body, and occurs naturally in the following foods: cow's milk, apple, avocado, banana, blackberry, blueberry, broccoli, chili powder, corn, cucumber, eggplant, grape (red and green), grapefruit, haddock, honey, hops, mushroom, orange, peach, pear, pineapple, strawberry, tomato, watermelon, yeast mix, cooked beef, cooked chicken, and cheese.

Gallic acid

There are very few plants that don't contain this compound; Occurs naturally in the following foods: cow's milk, apple, apricot, banana, barley, basil, lima bean, navy bean, pinto bean, red bean, soybean, string bean, beer, blackberry, blueberry, brussel sprouts, cantaloupe, cashew nut, cauliflower, american cheese, cheddar cheese, cottage cheese, cocoa, coconut, peach, peanut, pear, pineapple, plum, potato, sweet potato, prune, pumpkin, quince, raisin, rhubarb, strawberry, tea, tomato, vanilla, walnut, watermelon, whole wheat, and yeast mix.

Phloridzin

In nature it is found mainly in the rose family. Occurs naturally in apple and sugar beet.

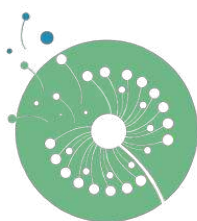
